Boo Ha Ha- October 25, 2008, 12 p.m. to 5 p.m.



CURBSIDE RECYCLING SERVICE

If you want the convenience of curbside recycling, you can get twice-a-month pickup service for an additional \$2 charge on your monthly utility bill.

Your recyclable newspaper, junk mail, magazines, office paper, plastic, glass and aluminum will be collected by the City's contract hauler, Tulsa Refuse Incorporated (TRI).

To sign up, call 596-9777 or sign-up online at www.cityoftulsa.org/Environment/Recycling/CurbsideSignUp.asp. Your first bin is free. You also may purchase a second bin for \$4, a lid for your bin for \$3, or a wheel kit for \$4.

How to Recycle

Once you have signed up for service, using curbside recycling is easy. No sorting is necessary. Simply put all recyclables in your City-issued recycling bin and put it on the curb on your scheduled recycling days. Materials with food or beverage resin and lids will contaminate a whole batch of recyclables.

GLASS: Accepted: all green, brown, and clear unbroken jars or bottles. Remove lid and rinse well, No sorting. Not Accepted: Plate glass from windows, drinking glasses, light bulbs, and other glass housewares

PLASTIC: Accepted: all bottles marked with a #1 or #2 in the recycling chasing arrows logo marked on the bottom of the container. Remove lid and rinse well, No sorting. Not Accepted: Bottles marked with a number other than #1 or #2, including tubs for yogurt and butter, reusable food containers, and plastic bags.

ALUMINUM: *Accepted:* all aluminum beverage cans. Rinse well, No sorting. *Not Accepted:* No other form of aluminum such as foil, pans, or lawn furniture

NEWSPAPER AND PAPER: *Accepted:* all newspapers, including advertising slicks and special section inserts, junk mail, catalogs, and office paper. Keep dry, do not tie, you can bundle in grocery bags, place separate from other recyclables. *Not Accepted:* No hardbound books, paperback books, telephone books, wax paper, cardboard or fiberboard.

SOUTH PEORIA AVENUE, EAST 38TH STREET TO EAST 36TH PLACE: Traffic is limited to one northbound lane and one southbound lane for two weeks during crosswalk construction. Completion is scheduled for August 2008.

SOUTH UTICA AVENUE, EAST 36TH STREET TO EAST 31ST STREET: Traffic is limited to one-way northbound for six weeks during installation of a waterline. Completion is scheduled for March 2009.

RIVERSIDE DRIVE, 28TH STREET TO 31ST STREET: Traffic is limited to one northbound lane and one southbound lane for three to four weeks during repair of a sanitary sewer line. The parking lot near the River Parks pedestrian bridge also is closed during the construction.

GOOD NEIGHBOR AWARD PROGRAM

The Good Neighbor Award was happily received in May by our honorable Mayor Kathy Taylor for her prompt and efficient handling of power restoration to Brookside and other neighborhoods following the 2007 ice storm. The mayor of our great city praised the Brookside Neighborhood Association for our being one of the largest and most active neighborhood associations in Tulsa. Thanks to each and all of you for making the BNA a remarkably influential positive force in our area for good.

THE ENCLAVE ON BROOKSIDE A REALITY

The Tulsa City Council unanimously approved a \$30 million dollar controversial building project on July 17. The Enclave on Brookside, an upscale apartment complex at 39th and Rockford Avenue will now be a reality.

G.T. Bynum recieved nearly 180 signatures against the project but just as many in favor of it.

Houston-based development company, Bomasada Group, Inc., plans to break ground this fall on the two year project. What once started as a 5 story structure has now been reduced to 4 stories with only 3 stories facing Rockford Avenue. It will include indoor and outdoor swimming pools, a fitness center, a billiards room, a wine bar, and a cyber café. In the first draft, a parking garage was planned for the ground level with 4 floors of apartments above. The 240 units will rent from \$800 to \$2000. A total of 418 parking spaces will accompany to apartment building.
